#### Wait...you may ask...WHY would I do this?


We live in a world of words ~ much of what we hear each day causes hurt. Scripture can guide, heal, and offer new perspectives for us in these days.



The rich keep getting richer, and the poor keep getting poorer as the saying goes. But why is this true? What factors created this inequality and continue to keep it in existence?

**THE RACIAL WEALTH GAP LEARNING SIMULATION,** a program of Bread for the World, is an interactive tool that helps people understand the connections among racial equity, hunger, poverty, and wealth.

Participants learn how federal policies have created structural inequalities such as property ownership and education, and how these policies increase hunger and poverty in communities of color.

#### **Community Meal ~ October 25th**


