Dwelling In the Gospels

During the season of Lent, I invite you to dive in and dwell in the Gospels. Between now and Easter Sunday (April 9th), I encourage you to join me on a journey in reading Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The good news is that you can even begin this the week of March 6 and you still finish by Easter. I hear everyone thinking, "Wait, can Wes really assign me homework?"

This is simply an invitation. I understand if this Lent is not the right time for you to engage in this practice. I understand if you are in a season of stress and strain, that perhaps this Lent you need to subtract something from your life rather than add something to your life.

This Lent you may long to sit outside and listen to God's first testament called, "Creation," which was God's wisdom before the Hebrew Testament or New Testament. I honor that in the world today this may feel like one more thing and just too much.

But, stay with me, if there is some curiosity at reading the Gospels during Lent, this might be the time to dare to dive in. Please know that reading the

Each day in the coming weeks I will share a Morning Meditation on Facebook and my blog. You can read the devotion as a stand-alone reflection without reading the assigned chapters.

If you'd like to see the reading plan, see the next page. One other note, especially to my friends reading the Bible in a year, we will eventually get to the other gospels in the year to come. So, don't feel the need to take this on right now. I will send you my meditations on each gospel when that reading comes up for us.

I pray that this opportunity will help you meet God, Jesus, and the Spirit as if for the first time. That by dwelling in the Word...the Word starts to dwell in you to help you edit the story you are telling yourself. That by tasting the good news of God's love, we are fed in ways that can fuel our lives for the living of these days. Wherever you are, I continue to pray God will enfold and hold you in this season of Lent. Amen.



Brady Sarasota has been working hard to urge people to reach out to their legislators to stop a bill that would allow Floridians to carry concealed weapons without purchasing permits or undergoing training. The governor has said he would sign SB 543 when it reaches his desk, but there's still time to make some calls.

Meanwhile, Brady rallies will continue at the southern end of the Sarasota Bayfront parking lot from **4 to 5 p.m. every Thursday through April 6**. Come on out; the chapter has signs for you to use and free tshirts for those who would like to become a part of this worthy mission.

Mark your calendars, too, for the **spring wrap-up on April 13 in our own Oasis Center**. There will be food and time to share ideas for activities going forward. You do not have to be a Brady member to attend. Brady Sarasota's Council will publish a 2023-24 calendar well before the rallies resume in October.



We Can End Hunger in Our Time

This is a bold claim, but it is one that **Bread for the World** is working to achieve. Bread for the World is a Christian advocacy organization urging U.S. decision makers to do all they can to pursue a world without hunger. The mission is to educate and equip people to advocate for policies and programs that can help end hunger in the U.S. and around the world.

They fulfill this mission by working with churches, campuses, and other organizations to engage people in organized advocacy and urging members of Congress to pass legislation that will help end hunger.

Church Council recently agreed First Congregational UCC will join Bread for the World in this effort and that it will be one of this year's Easter Love recipients.

You will be hearing more about this organization and in March there will be a coordinated effort called an "Offering of Letters" to encourage our congress people to renew farm bill programs such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and international food aid programs.

For years we have been sending suggested action messages to about 85 members, and we want to expand our list by including YOU, if you want to add your name, even if only to be made aware of the issues. You would not be required to phone or write to anyone unless you have the time and inclination! Our most recent messages involved the upcoming bill which, if passed, would allow the open carry of guns in Florida. FYI, we always include names and phone numbers of senators and representatives to call, or their addresses.

We will be SO happy to add you to our list. In the case of meeting attendance, there will be organization leaders who will do the talking. Your job will be to fill the seats and add your support by just being there. A very important role!!





Have You Visited Our Butterly/Pollinator Garden?

Welcome to our lovely butterfly/pollinator garden. Located at the back of the church near the Labyrinth, it is a work in progress.

We have some added new plants to explicitly attract certain butterflies such as a white Scorpion Tail which attracts the Gulf Fritillary and Gray Hairstreak. Look for the identifying white tags!

Almost a year ago we bought a healthy, Simpson's Stopper which will eventually be a showpiece in the garden. Look for the pretty small white flowers which cover this bushy tree in the Spring. Later in the fall, red berries replace the flowers.

The Green Team aims to plant all native Florida plants to attract butterflies of all sorts and other pollinators. Most of our purchases come from Sweet Bay Nursery in Parrish. Their plants are all native to Florida, and they have very helpful workers who have guided us in our purchases. It is great fun to visit the nursery and stroll around to see what new plants might be beneficial to our garden at church.

You will not want to miss this compelling program.






Ready Readers ~ March 9th
