

#### **ENGAGING SCRIPTURE**

**In June, we will celebrate PRIDE month**. You are especially invited to June 9<sup>th</sup> after worship for a speaker from ALSO Youth on the topic of pronouns. All are welcome, sign up after church.

In solidary with the Brady Campaign, you are invited to **wear orange to church on Sunday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>**. As you may know, Brady Sarasota and other local groups were planning to gather on June 8 at Bayfront Park to see the Ringling Bridge lit orange for Gun Violence Awareness month. We learned yesterday that the Florida Department of Transportation had decided that no bridge in the

state could light up for awareness of any event or group this summer. Instead, bridges are to be illuminated in red, white and blue from Memorial Day to Labor Day to celebrate the sales tax holiday bill signed by Gov. Ron DeSantis. Other groups that would have seen their colors on the bridge this summer: Pride, Juneteenth, Equality Day, National Recovery Month and World Fragile X Day. It's taken some time for Brady and Moms Demand Manasota, working together, to be approved for the bridge observance. We were not notified of the change directly; we read about it on blogs and in newspapers. We haven't decided our next step but will keep you posted. Save that June 8 date at 8 pm, though. We may just show up at the park -- orange lights or no orange lights. And we still ask you to wear your orange shirts for Brady or rainbow colors for Pride to church on Sunday, June 2. Meanwhile, consider calling the governor's office at (850) 717-9337 and the FDOT at (850) 414-4100 to express your displeasure about the bridge ruling.
