

Worth Repeating ~ October 13th worship ~ after the storm Gather Us In (Verses 1 & 4) ~ By Marty Haugen

Here in this place new light is streaming; Now is the darkness vanished away. See in this place our fears and our dreamings; Brought here to you in the light of this day. Gather us in, the lost and forsaken; Gather us in, the blind and the lame, Call to us now, and we will awaken; We shall arise at the sound of our name.

Not in the dark of buildings confining; Not in some heaven, light years away.

But here in this place the new light is shining; Now is the kingdom, and now is the day.

Gather us in, and hold us forever; Gather us in, and make us your own.

Gather us in, all peoples together, Fire of love in our flesh and our bone

Per the composer: In the first stanza, we find that this community is one of hope where "new light is streaming." It is also a community of honesty where we can bring both "our fears and our dreamings" into "the light of this day." This is also a community of inclusiveness that includes "the lost and forsaken" and the "blind and the lame." Regardless of who we are, we have an identity in this community as we respond to "the sound of our name" (Christian), given at our baptism.



The concluding stanza clarifies that the work of the kingdom takes place neither "in the dark of buildings conf heaven, light years away." The work of the kingdom takes place now in the midst of the gathered, inclusive community.

2018 Farm Bill on Extension since 11/16/2023



Butterfly Gardens on Our Campus

There are probably butterfly larvae (caterpillars) in your yard that you didn't even realize were already there living their lives. Florida butterflies lay their eggs on many native plants that are very common in our landscape, yet we may not realize they are there. But **Florida's butterfly population is imperiled due to loss of native habitat and host plants** that are necessary for them to complete the metamorphosis from egg to larva to adult.

By planting wildflowers that provide nectar, pollen and larval food for our native butterflies and moths, we can help fill the void between fragmented natural habitats. Even small native wildflower plots can be steppingstones in a pollinator pathway that help insects reach parks, natural areas and roadside wildflowers.

Your Green Team maintains a large butterfly garden and is currently extending into an adjacent area. These spaces help to beautify the church campus while providing an environment where Central Florida butterflies such as Swallowtails, Longwings and Monarchs can thrive. Come visit these areas by the labyrinth when you have an opportunity!





November 14th: *How to Say Babylon* by Safiya Sinclair. Throughout her childhood, Safiya Sinclair's father, a volatile reggae musician and a militant adherent to a strict sect of Rastafari, was obsessed with the ever-present threat of the corrupting evils of the Western world outside their home, and worried that womanhood would make Safiya and her sisters morally weak and impure. For him, a woman's highest virtue was her obedience.

Safiya's extraordinary mother, though loyal to her father, gave her the one gift she knew would take Safiya beyond the stretch of beach and mountains in Jamaica their family called home: a world of books, knowledge, and education she conjured almost out of thin air. When she introduced Safiya to poetry, Safiya's voice awakened. As she watched her mother struggle voicelessly for years under relentless domesticity, Safiya's rebellion against her father's rules set her on an inevitable collision course with him. Her education became the sharp tool to hone her own poetic voice and carve her path to liberation. Rich in emotion and page-turning drama, *How to Say Babylon* is "a melodious wave of memories" of a woman finding her own power. (NPR)
